There is another ski field just a quick bus ride away, near the neighbouring village of Kaprun. It's a glacier ski area on the Kitzsteinhorn mountain. It's also a major tourist destination for non-skiers wanting to get a good taste of the mountains, with scenic gondola rides to 3029m at the top of the Kitzsteinhorn. We had been saving this adventure for a sunny day and that was the forecast for today. Our weather surprise this morning was not blue skies, but frozen fog. The mountain webcams showed beautiful weather though, so we were on our way,

The journey to the top of the Kitzsteinhorn involves two gondolas and a cable car. The kids left their skis at the top of the second gondola as there was no ski run from the very top. The cable car to the summit was the most impressive with two huge spans way up high. Definitely not a ride for people scared of heights!
